Minutes of 14th Academic Council Meeting held on 4th September, 2021

Welcoming the Academic Council Members

The Chairman welcomed all the Academic Council Members with a special invitation to the three new JNTUH nominees. He introduced the new members, Dr. M. Asha Rani, Dr. K. Ram Mohan Reddy and Dr. S. Tara Kalyani to the Council and put forth the following Agenda.

Points Discussed in the Meeting

1. To approve the minutes of 13th Academic Council Meeting.

The Chairman has presented the minutes of the 13th Academic Council meeting held on 6th July 2020.

Resolution: Noted and approved.

Submission of Action taken report on the minutes of 13th Academic Council Meeting.

Chairman has presented the details of the action taken on recommendations the 13th Academic council meeting.

Resolution: The members noted and appreciated the efforts taken.

2. To approve the academic regulations and syllabi of B. Tech II, III and IV year syllabus under R20 regulations.

The Chairman informed the members that, the Board of Studies of all the Departments have met in the month of July 2021 and revised the course structure and syllabi for (B.Tech. II, III and IV years). These are for the students to follow who joined the college from the academic year 2020-2021 onwords. The course structure and syllabi has been shared with the members in advance. Requested the members to Examine and approve the course structure and syllabi which was approved by the respective Board of Studies members. For the Above students R20 Regulations shall be followed.

Dr. Asha Rani has suggested introducing Courses under MOOCS in the curriculum, if possible in the next BoS. Responding to this, The chairman informed the members that it will be discussed in the College Academic Committee. She also informed to share the R20 regulations to all the Council members which were agreed upon by the chairman.

Dr. M.V. Krishna Murthy suggested to send URL of all the documents to the members

Hechue (1), Tutorial (1) 4 Peached (P) hours over shown as 300 (O) for both Industrial Oriented Mini Project & Compedeniu Viva Voce. Dr. S. Tare Kelyani suggested to include either Prentice (P) or Tutorial (T) components for Industrial Oriented Mini Project for the benefit of students before the meeting instead of forwarding the supporting documents. Chairman thanked for his suggestion.

Resolution: The course structure and syllabus is approved by the members.

3. To approve the procedure adopted regarding moderation rules and in providing grace marks for B.Tech. Students.

The chairman has indicated that there are University orders related to moderation norms for the grant of grace marks and adjustment (JNTUH Order No. U.N. No. JNTUH/95/2012 dated 15-05-2012 and its supplement). It was requested that the above orders may be permitted to follow by the VJIT. (See Annexure – I for the copies of University orders.)

Resolution: Members resolved to follow the JNTUH rules in vogue, with respect to grace marks and moderation rules.

4. To review Results of U.G and P.G. Programs.

Chairman presented the results of U.G. and P.G. Programs. Members have suggested that the Placement team may concentrate more on PG students job opportunities in order to improve the P.G. admission and also indicated that, a few organizations are looking forward to recruit the PG students.

Resolution: Members expressed satisfaction over the performance of students.

5. To approve the question paper pattern of Midterm examination and Semester End Examinations for U.G. and P.G. in view of COVID conditions.

The Chairman placed the Question paper pattern being followed keeping in view the present COVID conditions, which was approved by the council for the last academic year. As the COVID conditions are being prevailed the Chairman requested the council members to approve and ratify the same question paper pattern for the academic year 2021-22 as well. It has been discussed the pattern of question paper for Mid and Semester End examinations of UG and PG Program..

Dr. Tara Kalyani suggested to consider proportionate time duration for Midterm and Semester End examinations.

Resolution: The members approved the question paper pattern to be implemented only for academic yea 2021-22.

8. Information regarding the proposed visits of UGC Autonomous team and the status of re-accreditation of NBA and NAAC.

Chairman informed the members that the visit of UGC team for the grant of second time Autonomy for the college is scheduled on September 10th and 11th of 2021. It is also informed to the members about the submission of SSR for NAAC re-accreditation and the submission of Prequalifies for NBA accreditation under Tier 1 for five U.G. Programs (B.Tech. CSE, Mech., EEE, ECE and IT)

9. To approve the request for one time chance, extension for one year.

Chairman brought to the notice of the members that, a M. Tech (CSE) student by name Mrs. Deepthi Sathish, bearing H. T. Number 1591105807 of 2015-17 batch could not take some of the examination of her M.Tech. course because of a serious accident took

place to her father in Kerala (their native state) and she has to take care of her father in view of her domestic condition. Further she has crossed the 4 years from the date of admission (double the Duration of the prescribed course). In this situation she now approached the institute to give one year chance to clear all her backlogs including dissertation work. In this context, the Director placed the matter before the academic council to consider and grant one time chance for the above candidate as a special case.

Resolution: Members after careful considerations of her case approved to grant one more year as last chance to complete the requirements for the award of M. Tech. Degree., i.e., to attempt & clear supplementary exams.

10. To approve the promotion rules.

The chairman informed that, the students were detained for want of minimum Attendance requirements and minimum credit requirement. However, because of prevailing COVID-19 conditions, Govt. and University have certain guidelines relax on Attendance and credit requirements for promoting the student to next year. Chairman requested the members that, keeping in view of Prevailing pandemic situation, permission may please be granted to the Institute to promote the students to next Year exempting from the Minimum Requirement of attendance and credits.

Resolution: Approved

11.Permission to follow academic regulations of Revised R15 Regulations of JNTUH while dropping the subjects.

The Chairman brought to the notice of the members that, in R15 regulations both in VJIT and JNTUH there is a scope drop two subjects as shown below:

(a) From VJIT R15 Regulations:

The dropping of courses condition as made in R15 Regulation by VJIT.

As per the point 7.7 under MINIMUM ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS of VJIT,

"After securing 192 Credits as specifies for the successful completion of the entire UG P, an exemption of 6 credits (two subjects with 3 Credits each) may be permitted to drop resulting in 186 Credits for UG P performance evaluation. Accordingly, the performance of student in 186 Credits shall be taken into account for the calculation of the final CGPA and shall be indicated in the Grade Card. However, the student's performances in the earlier individual semesters, with the corresponding SGPA for which already Grade Cards are given, will not be altered. Further, the optional drop out for such 6 credits shall not be allowed for i) Open Elective Subjects ii) Laboratory Courses iii) Industrial Training / Mini Project iv) Seminar v) Major Project vi) Comprehensive Viva"

(b) Revised R15 Regulations of JNTUH

1.3 of the R15 Regulation of JNTUH (under award of Degree)

The candidate shall register for 226 credits (224 + 2 (gender Sensitization course) and secure 218 (216 +2)) credits. The student can avail the exemption of two subjects up to 8 credits, that is one Open elective and One elective subject or two elective subjects, with compulsory subjects as listed below.

In VJIT regulation there is additional boundary conditions of Open electives not drop. In view of this chairman has requested for the permission members to follow revised R15 regulations JNTUH for the students of VJIT with retrospective.

12. Feedback taken from stakeholders on curriculum

A discussion has been made on feedback taken from the stakeholders on curriculum for the academic year 2020-21. The main points observed from the stakeholders' feedback are listed as below,

- Few Electronics courses may be added for students which can help them to enter electronics domain

- Advanced courses like Python Programming, Artificial Intelligence, Mobile Application Development
 using Android, Internet of Things, Data Science, Block chain Technologies etc.., have been introduced
 in the curriculum for CSE and IT Branches.
- System Design using Verilog HDL, Embedded Systems and IOT courses are introduced for EEE students into R20 course structure
