1. Minutes of the 40th Board of Governors meeting held on 10th January 2025

The Principal, Dr. A. Srujana, Welcomed all the members and introduced herself as this is her 1st BOG meeting after taking charge. Further, she introduced the new member of BoG, Dr. P. Srinivas Rao, Dean Exams, to the Board Members. Dr. Srujana expressed her gratitude to all members for attending the meeting and initiated the proceedings with the permission of the Chairman.

The Principal, Dr A.Srujana briefed the minutes of the 40th Board of Governors Meeting held on 10th January 2025, along with the Action Taken Report (ATR) on decisions taken therein.

The Chairman of BoG Prof Murty made the following suggestions,

1. Include industry professionals in the Board of Studies (BoS) and ensure their active involvement in curriculum development.
2. Recruit Professor of Practice (PoP) across departments and take inputs from industry experts, who can take online classes to teach identified short term courses. They can also share their hands-on experience and real-time case studies.
3. Implement "One India, One Subscription" across the institution.
4. Encourage faculty to publish in Q1 journals.
5. Provide incentives based on the number of Q1 papers published which will enhance NIRF ranking.
6. Encourage semester-long internships for students by allotting credits.

Members reviewed and confirmed the minutes unanimously.

Prof. Murty gave various suggestions to improvise research & professional practice and perception parameters.

Key Discussion Points on Research Focus and Funding;

- Dr. Srujana highlighted that the primary institutional focus will be on improving Research and Perception parameters.
- She confirmed that funding for faculty members aligns with the norms of the revised research policy, including seed funding support for research projects.

Prof. Murty's Proposal;

- Prof. Murty recommended discontinuing incentives tied directly to publications.
- Instead, he proposed establishing an individual Faculty Research Development Fund (RDF) for all doctorate-holding faculty, with dedicated allocations to better support their research endeavors.

3.1 Ratification of New Faculty Recruitment for AY 2025–26

- Dr. Srujana briefed the committee on the new faculty recruitment for the 2025–26 academic year, which includes 5 doctoral faculty members and 5 non-doctoral faculty members.
- Prof. Murty emphasized the need to increase the proportion of faculty holding Ph.D. qualifications.
- He recommended mandating that all non-doctoral recruits register for Ph.D. programs at the earliest possible opportunity.

4. Academic Affairs

4.1 Approval of Minutes from the 14th IQAC Meeting (11th August 2025)

The Principal outlined the following key discussion points from the 14th IQAC Meeting held on 11th August 2025 and sought approval from the members:

1. Preparation for UGC Autonomy Extension – Requirements and Progress Review.
2. Approval of Strategic Plan for A.Y. 2025–2030.
3. Institutional Development Plan (IDP) as per UGC Guidelines & NEP 2020.

The Principal highlighted the main points from the IQAC meeting regarding industry mentoring, noting that a detailed plan has been prepared to mentor students. The minutes were unanimously approved by the committee members.

- Approval of Boards of Studies Minutes for various departments regarding B.Tech I-Year (I-Semester and II-Semester) under R-25 regulations.
- Approval of Boards of Studies Minutes for the MBA Department under R-25 regulations.
- The minutes, provided in Annexure-5, were unanimously approved by the members.

4.3 Review of B.Tech Academic Performance for AY 2024–25

- The Principal presented a semester-wise comparison of B.Tech academic performance for 2024-25 against 2023-24, noting overall improvement across all semesters with consistent results.
- Prof. Murty suggested introducing AI-related courses into Civil and Mechanical Engineering curricula to boost performance and student enrolment.
- He also recommended launching new interdisciplinary B.Tech programs.
- A comparison of results from two consecutive batches is provided in Annexure-6.

4.4 Review of M.Tech and MBA Academic Performance for AY 2024–25

- The review showed overall improvement and consistency in academic performance across all semesters for M.Tech and MBA programs, except for M.Tech 2nd semester and MBA 3rd semester.
- Detailed academic performance data for M.Tech and MBA programs is provided in Annexure-7.

5. Research Affairs

5.1 Faculty Ph.D. Awards and Registrations

- Dr. Srujana informed the Board that 13 faculty members have been awarded Ph.D. degrees, while 120 faculty members are currently pursuing Ph.D. programs at various universities.
- Prof. Murty suggested that Ph.D. scholars publish at least one paper in a Q1 journal.
- He also recommended ensuring that all faculty registered for Ph.D. programs complete them within five years.

- All required formats have been prepared and uploaded to the UGC portal, with the formal application scheduled for submission in February 2026.

6.2 NBA Accreditation for CSE (Data Science) and Civil Engineering Programs in November 2026

- NBA compliance reports for CSE, IT, ECE, EEE, and Mechanical Engineering departments were submitted on December 7, 2024, followed by a team visit on April 6, 2025; all five departments received NBA Tier-1 reaccreditation valid until June 30, 2028.
- Civil Engineering's accreditation remains valid until June 2027, prompting a reaccreditation application in November 2026 under NBA's revised format.
- CSE (Data Science) will pursue first-time accreditation under the new NBA format.

- Discussion held on incorporating single-credit courses in creative arts, music, dance, and games to stimulate students' right brain activity.

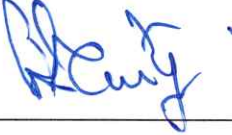


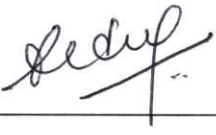

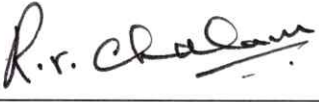





Prof. M.T. Naik's Suggestions (University Nominee)
